ON TRAINS AND BUSES

## Passengers, you have rights!

- You have the right to remain silent.
- When in doubt, do not answer questions about your citizenship or immigration status or sign any paperwork without the advice of a lawyer.
- ⇒ If you have valid immigration papers, you can provide them. Never provide false documents.
- → You can refuse a search of your belongings by saying "I do not consent to a search."
- You have the right to record video of immigration agents.

Tell your fellow passengers they have rights and should use them.





#### YOUR RIGHTS ON TRAINS AND BUSES

If immigration agents board your bus or train or are patrolling a bus or train station:



YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

remain silent.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

refuse a search.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

record video.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

inform others of their rights!



### **IMMIGRATION AGENTS ON YOUR BUS**

#### Passengers, you have rights!

- You always have the right to remain silent.
- ⇒ When in doubt, do not answer questions about your citizenship or immigration status or sign any paperwork without the advice of a lawyer. Any information you volunteer to immigration agents can and will be used against you to deport you.
- If you have valid immigration papers, you can provide them. Never provide false documents.

- You can ask immigration agents why they're stopping you.
- ➤ You have the right to record video of immigration agents.
- → You can refuse a search of your belongings by saying, "I do not consent to a search."
